ANATOMIC PATHOLOGY SPECIMEN COLLECTION

Specimens for pathological examination should be submitted in an appropriate container, labeled with patient's name, date of birth and type of specimen. An appropriate quantity of fixative (usually 10% formalin) should be added to the specimen immediately, if not using prefilled containers. Sides of container should be labeled, not covers.

*10 % formalin should not be added to specimens requiring special handling. See below.

Lymph node for diagnosis of ? lymphoma, or lymphadenopathy - Saline. Call CVMC lab ASAP to notify histology or pathologist on call.	
Sentinel node (s)	10% formalin
Axillary dissection (lymph nodes)	10% formalin
Pelvic node dissection	10% formalin

Notify Histology or pathologist on call ASAP.

Any "dry" specimen

Notify Histology or pathologist on call ASAP.

The histology requisition should be completed and the following information is necessary. At least two unique identifiers are required on the requisition and specimen, (i.e. name and date of birth, name and medical record number, etc.)

- 1. Patient's full name
- 2. Date of birth
- 3. Submitting physician and other physician's needing reports
- 4. Date
- 5. Preoperative diagnosis
- 6. Tissue removed
- 7. Significant clinical history
- 8. Any special instructions

If the requisition does not have adequate information, the office or submitting department will be called to gather this information.

SUBOPTIMAL SPECIMENS

If the specimen is unlabeled, the submitting department or office needs to be called. The specimen is either returned or held for identification and labeling by the originator. An accountability form will be signed by the labeling personnel and will be kept with the pathology requisition.

If the container and/or bag are contaminated, use gloves to remove the container from the bag, place the specimen number label on the container and place the container in a clean bag.

If a specimen is left unfixed or refrigerated without fixative for an extended period of time, notify the on call pathologist for instructions.
